



Colombo Consumer Price Index (CCPI)-(BASE 2013=100)

April, 2021 30-04-2021

Department of Census and Statistics Ministry of Finance

The Department of Census and Statistics (DCS) is the authorized agency to compile Colombo Consumer Price Index (CCPI). The base year used for compilation of CCPI from June 2011 to December 2016 was the year 2006/07. Following internationally accepted guidelines, it has been arranged to revise the base year from 2006/07=100 to 2013=100 in order to accommodate the changing expenditure patterns and in cooperate changes of goods & services available in the market. Accordingly, with respect to the new base, CCPI (Base 2013=100) will be released monthly commencing from January 2017 on the last working day of each month. It is emphasized that index numbers or inflation figures compiled under different base years cannot be compared.

The CCPI is compiled to indicate average changes in the prices of goods and services purchased by households in urban areas of Colombo district. Prices for items in the Colombo Consumer Price Index are collected from 14 selected centers located in Colombo namely Pettah, Maradana, Wellawatta, Dematagoda, Grandpass, Borella, Kirulapone, Dehiwala, Kotte, Nugegoda, Kolonnawa, Rathmalana, Narahenpita and Rathmalana dedicated economic centers. Prices are collected weekly from the outlets located within each of the above market areas including Lak Sathosa and a supermarket. The consumer basket includes 392 items, which represent the typical urban household consumption expenditure. The CPI weights are derived from the Household Income and Expenditure Survey (HIES) 2012/13.

1. Variations in Colombo Consumer Price Index

1.1 Month on Month (M on M) Change of CCPI:

The CCPI for all items for the month of April 2021 was 138.8 and it records a decrease of 0.1 in index points that is 0.04 percentage compared to the month of March 2021 for which the index was 138.9. This represents a decrease of expenditure value by Rs 29.75 in the "Market Basket".

1.1.1 Contribution to M on M Changes:

Contributions to the change in CCPI from March 2021 to April 2021 were given in Table 2. The month on month change was contributed by decrease of Food items by 0.05% and an increase of Non Food items by 0.01%.

1.1.2 Contribution of Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages items: - 0.05%

As shown in Table 02, decreases in value change were reported for Coconuts (0.22%), Vegetables (0.15%), Red Onions (0.10%), Big Onions (0.10%), Turmeric Powder (0.05%), Tamarind (0.05%), Potatoes (0.04%), Green Chilies (0.03%), Eggs (0.02%), Lime (0.02%) and Manioc (0.01%).

While increases in value change were reported for Fresh Fruits (0.24%), Sea Fish (0.18%), Chicken (0.08%), Coconut Oil (0.08%), Green Gram (0.05%), Rice (0.02%), Gram (0.01%), Cowpea (0.01%), Dried Fish (0.01%), Vegetable Oil (0.01%), Jak and Jak seeds (0.01%), Dhal Mysoor (0.01%), Soya Meat (0.01%) and Coffee Powder (0.01%).

1.1.3 Contribution of Non Food items: 0.01%

Among Non-Food groups, increases in value change was reported for the group of 'Transport' (0.01%).

However, an insignificant value changes were reported for the groups of 'Alcoholic beverages Tobacco and Narcotic', 'Clothing and Footwear' and 'Furnishing Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance'. Meanwhile, the price indices of 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels', 'Health', 'Communication', 'Recreation and Culture', 'Education', 'Restaurants and Hotels' and 'Miscellaneous Goods and Services' groups remained unchanged during the period.

2. Inflation

The CCPI is an economic indicator constructed to measure inflation which is defined as percentage change in CCPI over the year. There are two measures of inflation in general use. One measure is Year on Year base or Point to Point inflation (The percentage change in the CPI during the last 12 months). The other measure is Moving Average Inflation (The percentage difference between the average Price Index of last 12 months & the average Price Index of previous 12 months).

2.1 Year on Year (Year on Year) Inflation

The overall rate of inflation as measured by CCPI on Y on Y basis is 3.9% in April 2021 and Y on Y inflation calculate for the month of March 2021 was 4.1% (Table 3). The Year on Year inflation of Food Group has decreased from 9.6% in March 2021 to 9.0% in April 2021. While that Year on Year inflation of Non Food Group remained unchanged in March 2021 to April 2021.

2.2 Contribution to Y on Y inflation:

For the month of April 2021, on Year-to-Year basis, contribution to inflation by food commodities was 2.69%.

The contribution of Non Food items was 1.20%. This was mainly due to increases in value change in groups of 'Transport' (0.45%), 'Clothing and Footwear' (0.15%), 'Restaurants & Hotels' (0.30%), 'Miscellaneous Goods and Services' (0.10%),




'Health' (0.03%), 'Alcoholic Beverages Tobacco and Narcotics' (0.06%), 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' (0.06%) and 'Furnishing Household Equipment and routine Household Maintenance' (0.07%).

Decreases in value change were reported for the groups of Education' (0.01%) and 'Recreation and Culture' (0.01%) and the group of 'Communication' remained unchanged during the period.

2.3 Moving Average Inflation

The moving average inflation rate for the month of April 2021 is 3.9%. The corresponding rate for the month of March 2021 was 4.0%.



Information Note on Implications of second wave of COVID-19 on the Colombo Consumer Price Index (CCPI): April 2021

To keep the higher accuracy of the Consumer Price Index, the majority of price data are collected by personal visits by the DCS price collecting officers. The data collection by personal visit for the Colombo district was challenging due to the COVID-19 pandemic situation. In the Colombo urban areas, for the reference month: fourth week of March 2021 and first three weeks of April 2021 for some outlets price data were collected by personal visits by the DCS price collecting officers as usual manner and price data of other remaining outlets that were previously collected by personal visits were collected using phone by the DCS price collecting officers from outlets which were open.

In particular, the collection of prices has become increasingly difficult. Issues and challenges include increased numbers of missing items in sampled outlets, the temporary closure of retail outlets etc.

When facing numbers of missing prices, it is important to mentioned that all temporarily missing prices were imputed using the methods described in Consumer Price Index Manual.
