The base year is 2002 for the constant estimates of national accounts. This publication includes set of tables on Production Accounts based on International Standard Industrial Classification of all economic activities (ISIC Rev.3), General Government Expenditure based on Classification of the Functions of Government (COFOG), and Private Consumption Expenditure based on Classification of Individual Consumption according to Purpose (COICOP). Further, this publication is consisted of “Annually data series from 2002 to 2012”.

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PART ONE

ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE – 2012

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of Sri Lanka in the year 2011 which was Rs. billion 2,863.7 recorded an economic growth of 6.4 percent as increased to Rs. billion 3,047.3 in the 2012. The economic growth of Sri Lanka was 8.2 percent in the year 2011.

The percentage share of the three major sectors, namely the Agriculture, Industry, and Services to the total GDP constituted 11.1 percent, 30.4 percent and 58.5 percent respectively.

Among the three major sectors of the economy namely, Agriculture, Industry and Services registered growth rates as 5.8 percent, 10.3 percent and 4.6 percent respectively in 2012 over the previous year.

The sub sectors which registered relative significant growth in the reference year were “Highland crops” 8.3 percent, “Vegetable” 11.2 percent, “Plantation Development” 8.8 percent, “Fishing” 9.3 percent, “Mining and Quarrying” 18.9 percent, “Construction” 21.6 percent, “Hotels & Restaurant” 20.2 percent, “Post & Telecommunication” 7.9 percent and “Banking, Insurance, & Real Estate” 6.7 percent.

However, growth of “Tea”, “Minor Export Crops”, “Rubber” dropped by (-) 1.2 percent, (-) 5.0 percent and (-) 6.8 in 2012 relative to the 2011 respectively.

The annual inflation rate of 2012 which is measured by the Colombo Consumers’ Price Index (2006/2007 = 100) is 7.5 percent. This was 6.7 percent in 2011.

The GDP per-capita (“Per-capita income”- based on the GDP) at market prices was estimated at Rs.373,001 (US\$ 2923) in 2012 as against Rs. 313,576 (US\$ 2836) for this year 2011.

The index number of GDP implicit price deflator (2002 =100) rose to 248.8 in 2012, from 228.5 in 2011 registering inflation rate as 8.9 percent for the year 2012.

Private Final Consumption Expenditure (PFCE) at

current prices is estimated at Rs. billion 5,274.5 in 2012 and Rs. billion 4,568.4 in 2011. Gross Fixed Capital Formation (GFCF) at current prices is estimated at Rs. billion 2,189.8 in 2012 as against Rs. billion 1,772.5 in 2011. The corresponding share of GFCF to the GDP is 28.9 percent in 2012 and 27.1 percent in 2011.

Gross Savings at current prices in 2012 is estimated at Rs. billion 1,793.2 as against Rs. billion 1,405.0 in 2011 constituting 23.6 percent of GDP as against 21.5 percent in the previous year.

Agriculture Sector

The “Agriculture, Forestry, and Fishing” sectors showed a 5.8 percent growth in 2012 recovering from a slow growth of 1.4 percent in 2011.

Paddy

The growth of Paddy production grew by 1.3 percent in 2012. The gross extent sown decreased by 10.9 percent, and gross asweddumized extent decreased by 8.8 percent in 2012 over the previous year.

Tea

The value added of Tea has dropped by 1.2 percent for the year 2012 due to unusual rainfall pattern and adverse effect of decreasing Tea export prices in 2011 and 2012. This sector dropped by 1.2 percent in the year 2011 also.

Rubber

The value added of Rubber production dropped by 6.8 percent in 2012. This drop was due to labor problems created by falling prices of Rubber adversely affected for the maintenance of Rubber estates. Removing of tapped old Rubber plantation for Rubber replanting has increased in this period. In the previous year this sector grew by 2.1 percent.

Coconut

The growth rate of the Coconut sector in real terms increased by 6.0 percent in 2012 as compared to the 3.0 percent increase in 2011.

Minor Export Crops (MEC)

The growth rate of Minor Export Crops (MEC) dropped by 5.0 percent in 2012. It showed 19.0 percent decrease for the previous year.

Other Food Crops (OFC)

Other Food Crops sub sector which covers Highland Crops, Vegetable and Fruits recorded a growth of a 10.0 percent in 2012. In this, Highland Crops and Vegetables recorded an 8.3 and 11.2 percent growth respectively.

Livestock

The value added for this sector grew by 6.4 percent in 2012 as against the 7.3 percent in last year.

Fisheries

The overall Fishing industry grew by 9.3 percent in 2012. Of these “Inland Fishing” grew by 14.3 percent and “Marine Fishing” grew by 8.5 percent. Drought weather in latter part of the year cause to drop of inland fishing growth in 2012 Q4.

Industry Sector

The Industry sector grew by 10.3 percent for the year 2012 as against the growth rate of 10.3 percent in 2011.

Mining and Quarrying

The performance of Mining and Quarrying sub sector for the reference year grew by a growth rate of 18.9 percent for the year 2012, where as a growth rate of 18.5 percent was recorded for the year 2011. Precious Stones export quantity increased by 41.7 percent and the total Gem exports quantity increased by 41.9 percent for the year 2012.

Manufacturing

Manufacturing Industry recorded a growth rate of 5.2 percent in 2012 as against 7.9 percent in 2011. Factory Industry recorded a growth rate of 5.2 percent for 2012 as against that of 8.3 percent recorded in 2011.

The Processing Industry sub sector recorded a growth rate of 6.5 percent in 2012 as against the growth rate of 0.9 percent for 2011.

Electricity, Gas and Water

The value added of Electricity, Gas and Water sub sector recorded a growth rate of 4.4 percent for the year 2012 as against the growth of 9.2 percent for the year 2011.

The overall Electricity generated by 35.1 percent in 2012. Total Hydro power generation increased by 9.1 percent and the Thermal power generation increased by 52.2 percent in 2012.

The total Hydro power to Thermal power generation ratio is 1: 2.12 in 2012 and it was 1: 1.52 in 2011. Total power generated by Ceylon Electricity Board to private is 1: 0.94 in 2012 where as it was 1: 0.84 in 2011.

The quantity of Liquid Petroleum (LP) gas imported and purchased from Petroleum Corporation by Litro Gas Lanka Limited and Laughs Gas Company Limited increased 5.9 percent in 2012 and it was increased 11.4 percent in 2011.

The quantity of Water produced increased 7.2 percent in 2012 and it increased 4.4 in 2011.

Construction

In real terms, the Construction sub sector recorded higher growth in the year 2012 indicating 21.6 percent, while it was 14.2 percent for the year 2011. This growth was supported by the introduction of new development projects, on going large scale development projects and the operated rehabilitation and resettlement programmes, especially in Northern and Eastern provinces.

The total cement supply has increased to 5,862,926 MT. in 2012 from 4,568,348 MT. in 2011 indicating 28.3 percent increase.

Services

The overall Service sector marked 4.6 percent growth in 2012 as against 8.6 percent growth in the year 2011. This moderate growth was mainly due to lower growth rates of Import Trade, Export Trade and Transport & Communication increased by 1.0 percent, 0.8 percent and 6.2 percent respectively. These subsectors grew by 14.3 percent, 10.1 percent and 11.3 percent in the previous year respectively.

Wholesale and Retail Trade

The Export Trade Sector grew only by 0.8 percent for the year 2012. According to the Balance of Payment (BOP) Statistics of Central Bank of Sri Lanka (CBSL), exports earnings increased to Rs. Bn. 1245.5 in 2012 from Rs. Bn. 1167.6 in the year 2011, indicating 6.7 percent increase. Export unit value index increased by 7.1 percent whereas Volume Index dropped by 0.4 percent in the reference year.

The Import Trade Sector grew by 1.0 percent in 2012. Total expenditure for imports increased to Rs. Bn. 2,441.1 in 2012 from Rs. Bn. 2,241.5 in the year 2011 recording 8.9 percent increase. According to the Trade indices of CBSL, the import Volume Index and unit value index increased by 0.5 percent and 8.4 percent respectively in 2012.

Domestic Trade sub sector grew by 6.8 percent in the year 2012 as against 7.5 percent growth of previous year.

Transport & Communication

Transport & Communication sector indicated 6.2 percent growth in this year. The growth in 2011 was 11.3 percent. The “Passenger and goods transportation”, “Cargo handling” and “Post and Telecommunication” sub sectors grew by 6.0 percent, 5.7 percent, and 7.9 percent respectively.

Total number of new registration of vehicles decreased by 24.4 percent in the reference year.

Total telephone connections increased by 8.4 percent in this year. The reasons for this were expansion of telecommunication services, especially in newly liberated areas of Northern and Eastern Provinces, the expansion of speed limits of internet broadband connections, and reduction of charges.

Hotels and Restaurants

Hotels and Restaurants sector recorded 20.2 percent growth in 2012 as against the growth of 26.4 percent for the last year. Tourists’ arrival increased to 1,005,605 in 2012 from 855,975 in 2011 contributing an increase of 17.5 percent for the reference year. This is the highest ever recorded tourist arrivals in a year since 1969 and it is the second best increment rate that recorded in 2011. The major reason for this increment is the prevailed peace across the country. Tourists’ earnings increased by 44.1 percent in the reference year.

Government Services

Government Services show a growth rate of 1.4 percent in 2012 as against that of 1.2 percent in 2011.

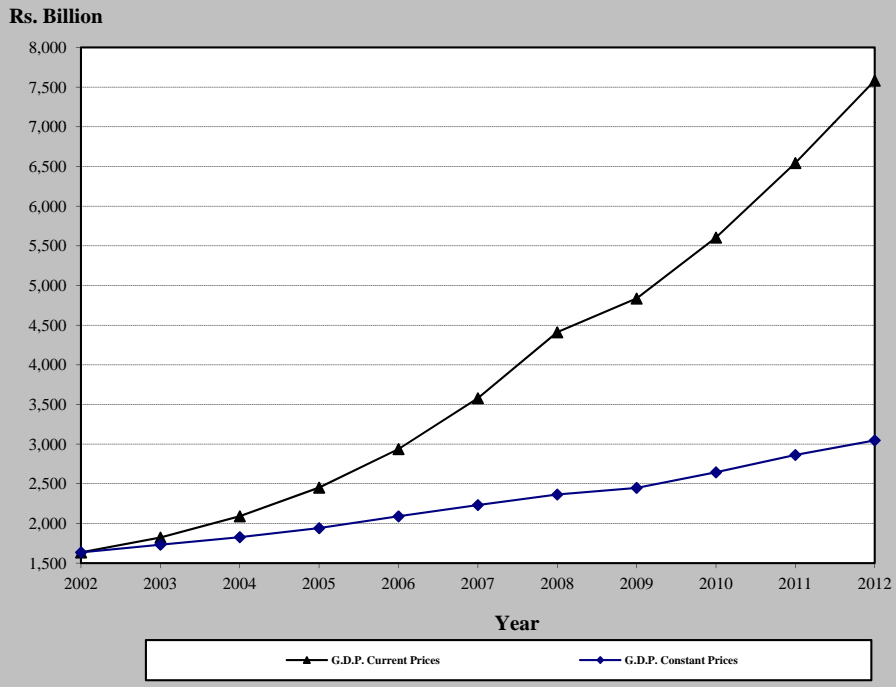

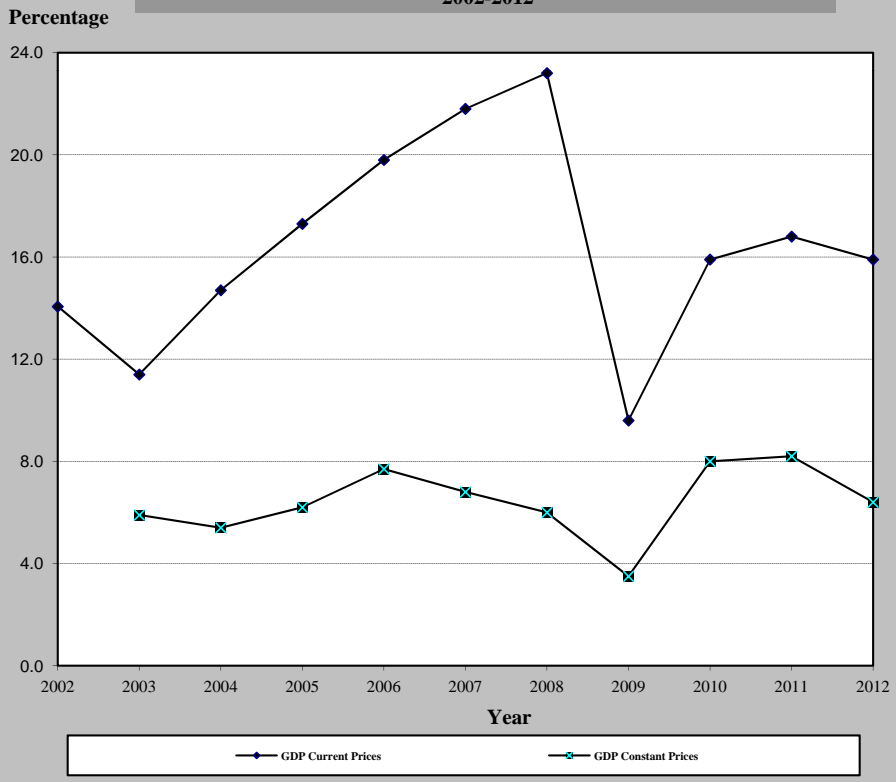

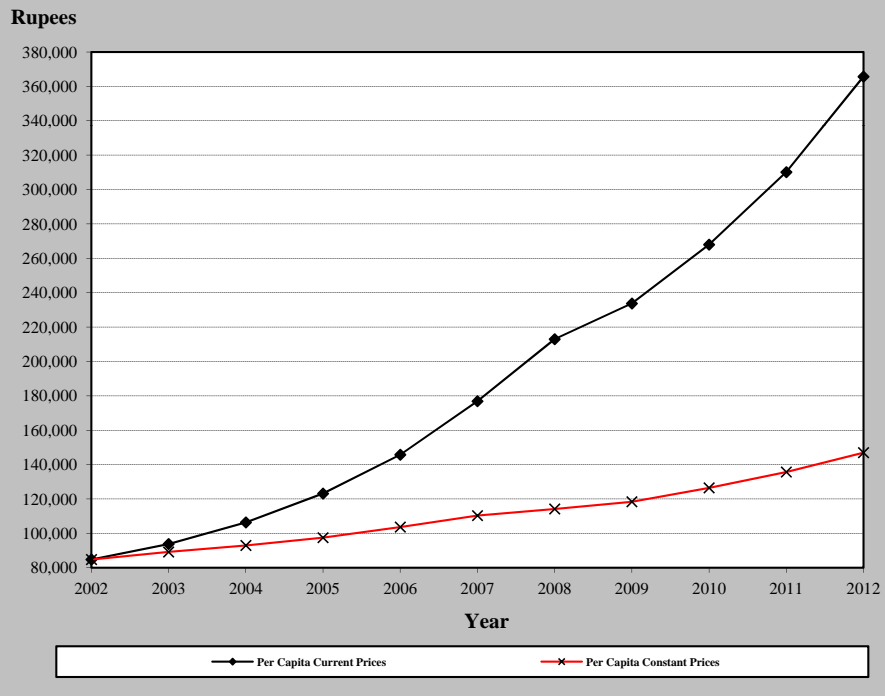
**Graph 1.1 - GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT AT CURRENT & CONSTANT (2002) PRICES
2002- 2012**



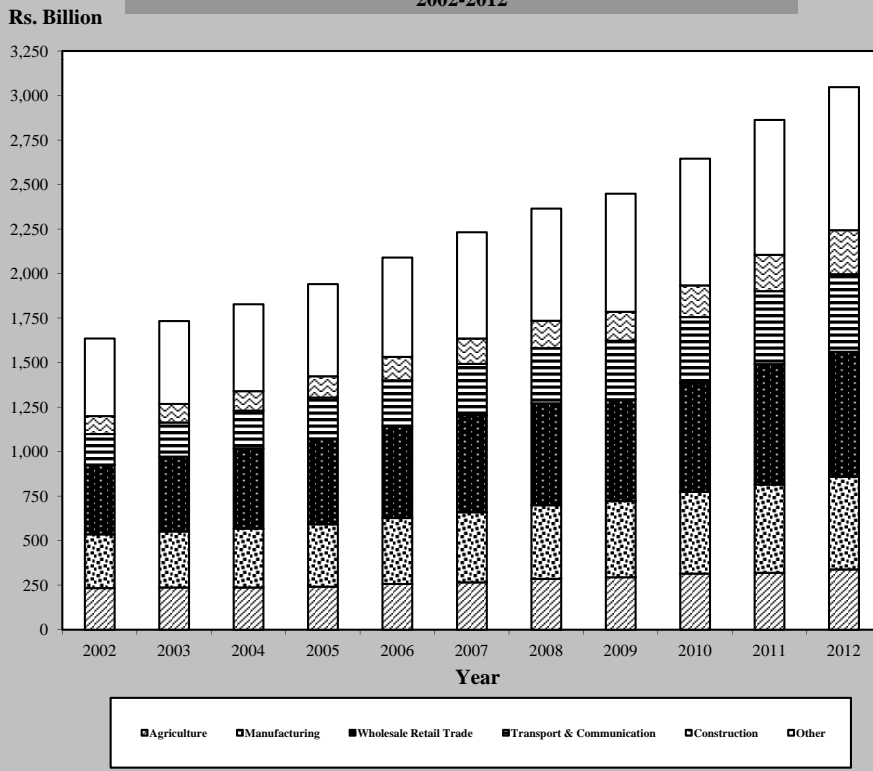

2002-2012**



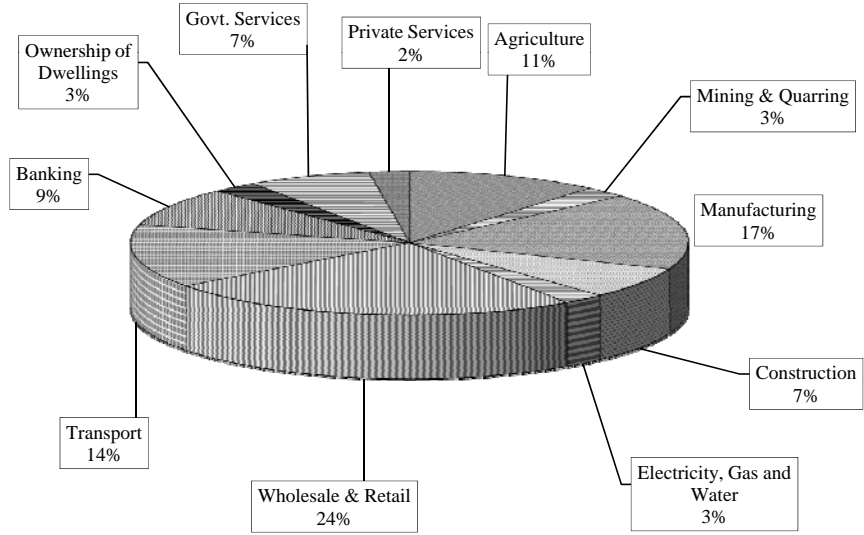
**Graph 1.3- PER CAPITA GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT AT CURRENT & CONSTANT (2002) PRICES
2002-2012**



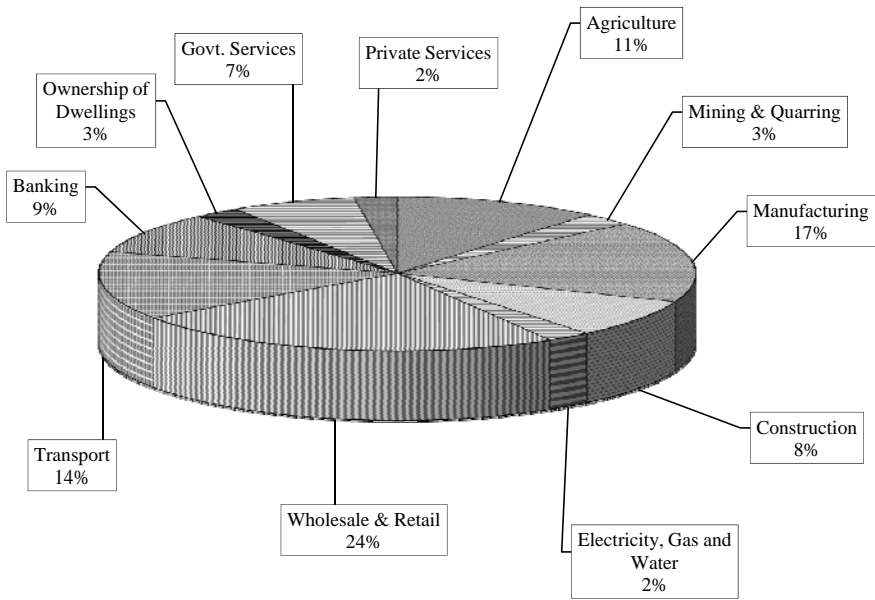
**Graph 1.4- GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY MAJOR SECTORS AT CONSTANT (2002) PRICES

PART TWO

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY INDUSTRIAL ORIGIN DETAILED SECTORAL REVIEW

01. AGRICULTURE, LIVESTOCK AND FISHERIES

The “Agriculture, Forestry, and Fishing” sector showed a 5.8 percent growth in 2012 recovering from a slow growth of 1.4 percent in 2011.

The sub sectors in Agriculture sector which registered relative significant growth in the reference year were “Highland Crops” 8.3 percent, “Vegetable” 11.2 percent, “Plantation Development” 8.8 percent, “Fishing” 9.3 percent. However, growth of “Tea”, “Minor Export Crops”, “Rubber” dropped by (-) 1.2 percent, (-) 5.0 percent and (-) 6.8 percent in 2012 relative to the 2011 respectively. The relatively higher growth rate in first half of 2012 was mainly due to favorable weather in maha season 2011/2012 extension of government fertilizer subsidies for Vegetables and Highland Crops since mid of 2011. However, an expected drought weather hindered Agriculture production in later part of 2012.

Agriculture sector (excluding Fishing) registered a growth of 5.3 percent for the year 2012.

Fishing sub sector indicated a growth rate of 9.3 percent for 2012.

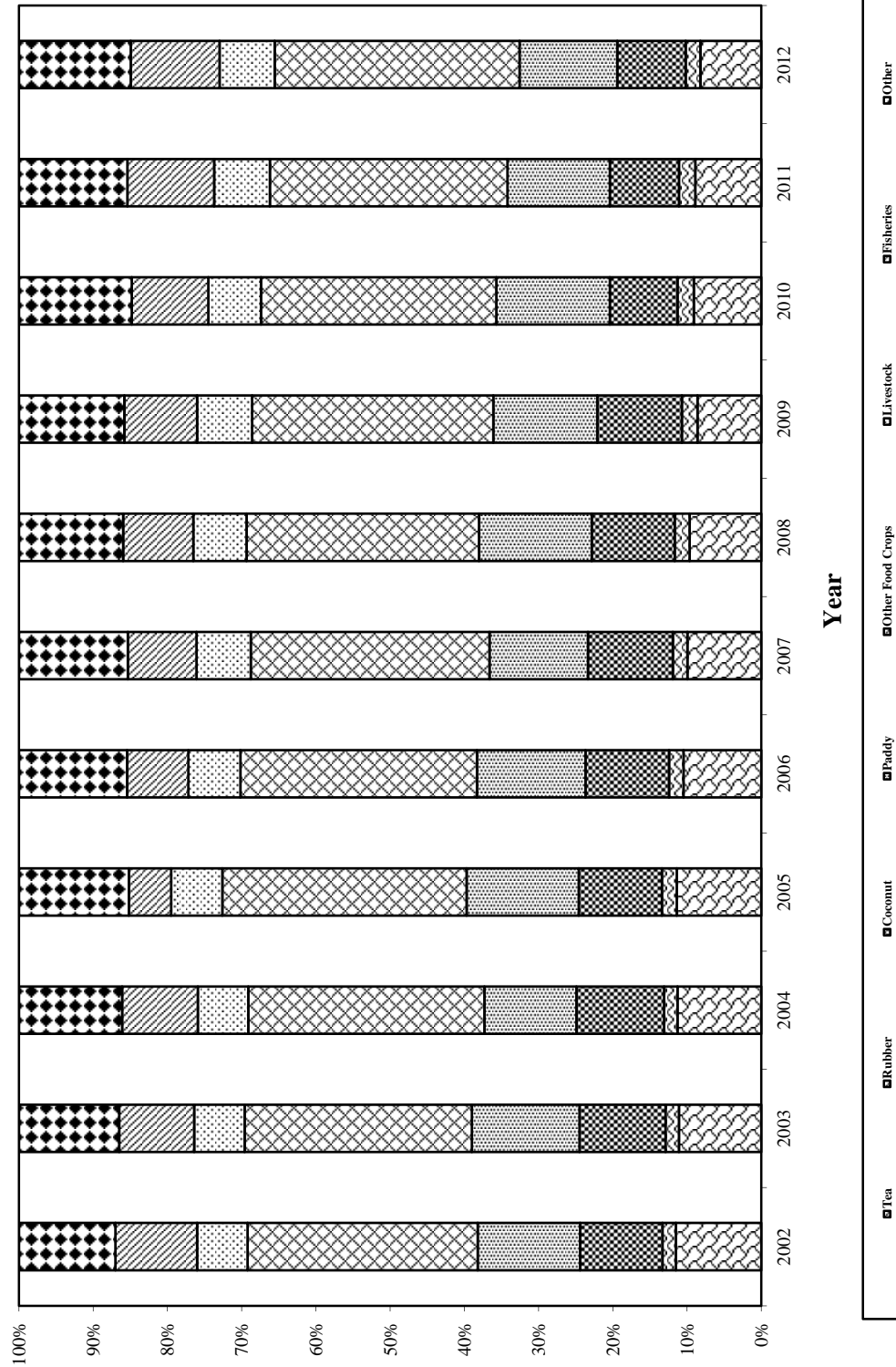

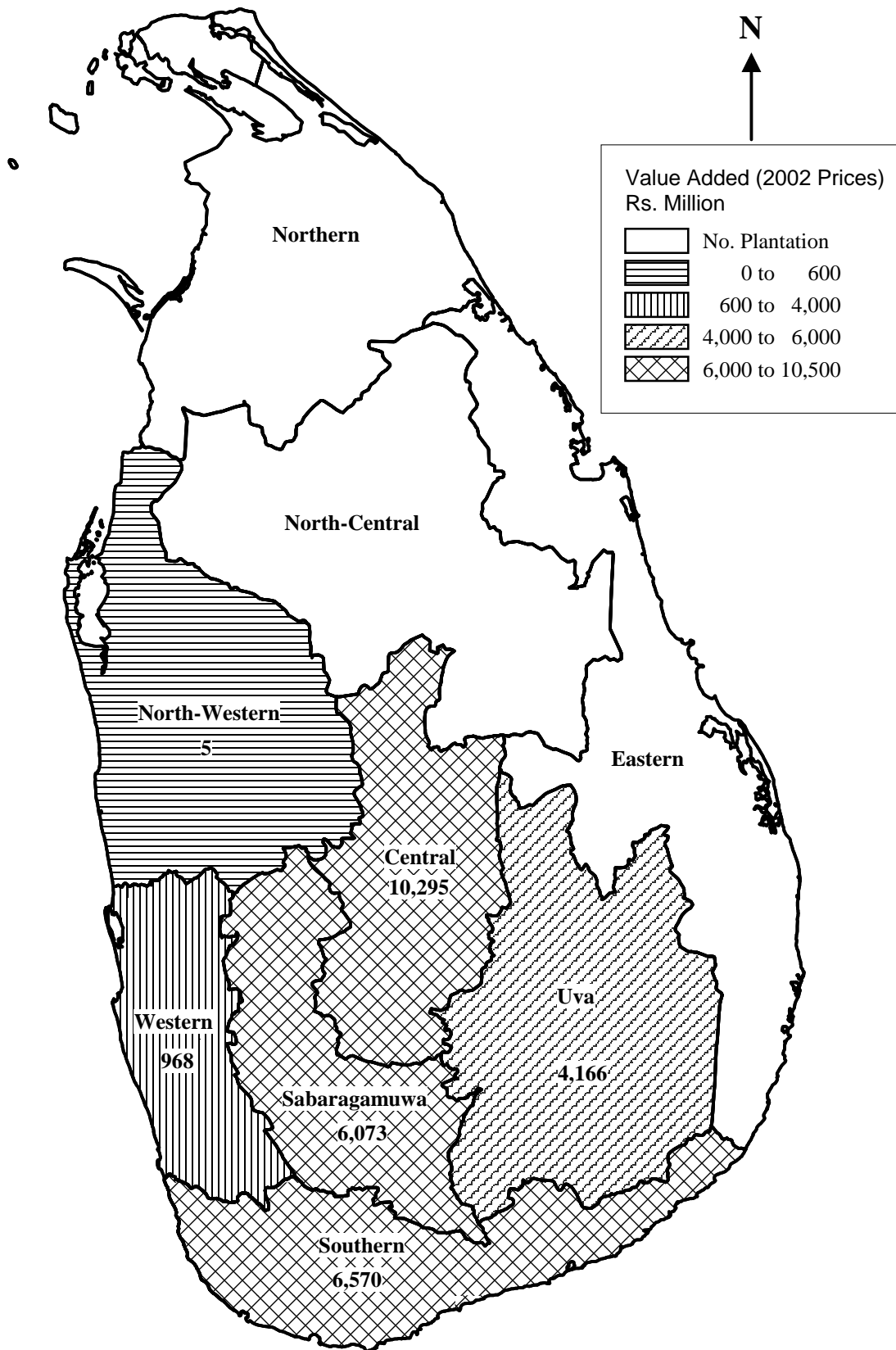

Coconut

The value addition of Coconut production showed a 6.0 percent increase in 2012 although it grew by 3.0 percent in the previous year.

The nut production increased by 7.8 percent in 2012 as the nut production of 2011 was 2727 Mn. nuts and 2940 Mn. nuts in 2012. However the prolonged drought at major Coconut grown areas in first six months of year 2012 may slightly decrease the 2012 Coconut production.

Paddy

The growth of Paddy production grew by 1.3 percent in 2012. The gross extent sown decreased by 10.9 percent, and gross asweddumized extent decreased by 8.8 percent in 2012 over the previous year. Paddy production during 2010/11 maha season affected by heavy rain recovered during 2011/12. Maha season showing an increase of 36.4 percent. However, severe drought condition experience during 2012 yala season adversely affected Paddy production resulting a decrease of 40.1 percent contributed to the slow growth momentum in Paddy production.

Other Food Crops (OFC)

Other Food Crops sub sector which covers Highland Crops, Vegetable and Fruits recorded a growth of a 10.0 percent in 2012. In this, Highland Crops and Vegetables recorded an 8.3 and 11.2 percent growth respectively.

A government fertilizer subsidy has expanded since May of 2011 for Highland Crops and Vegetables. An extent of Paddy field which abounded due to drought weather in Yala season 2012 used for Highland Crops cultivation. Promotion programmes for Vegetable cultivation, Home gardening and Maize cultivation implemented by the government. The favorable weather in Q1 and Q2 2012 affected to also support the increase of the Vegetable production.

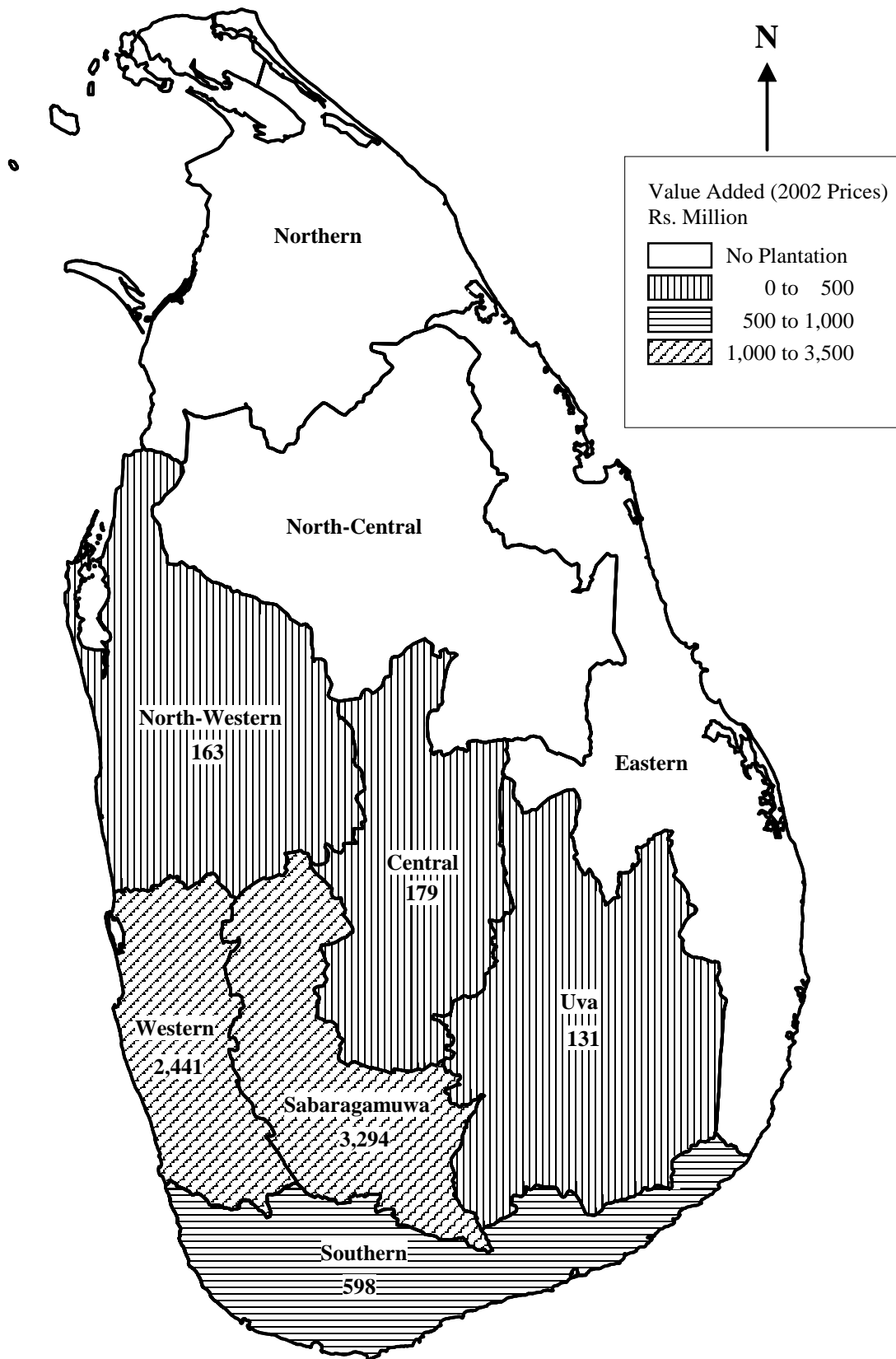

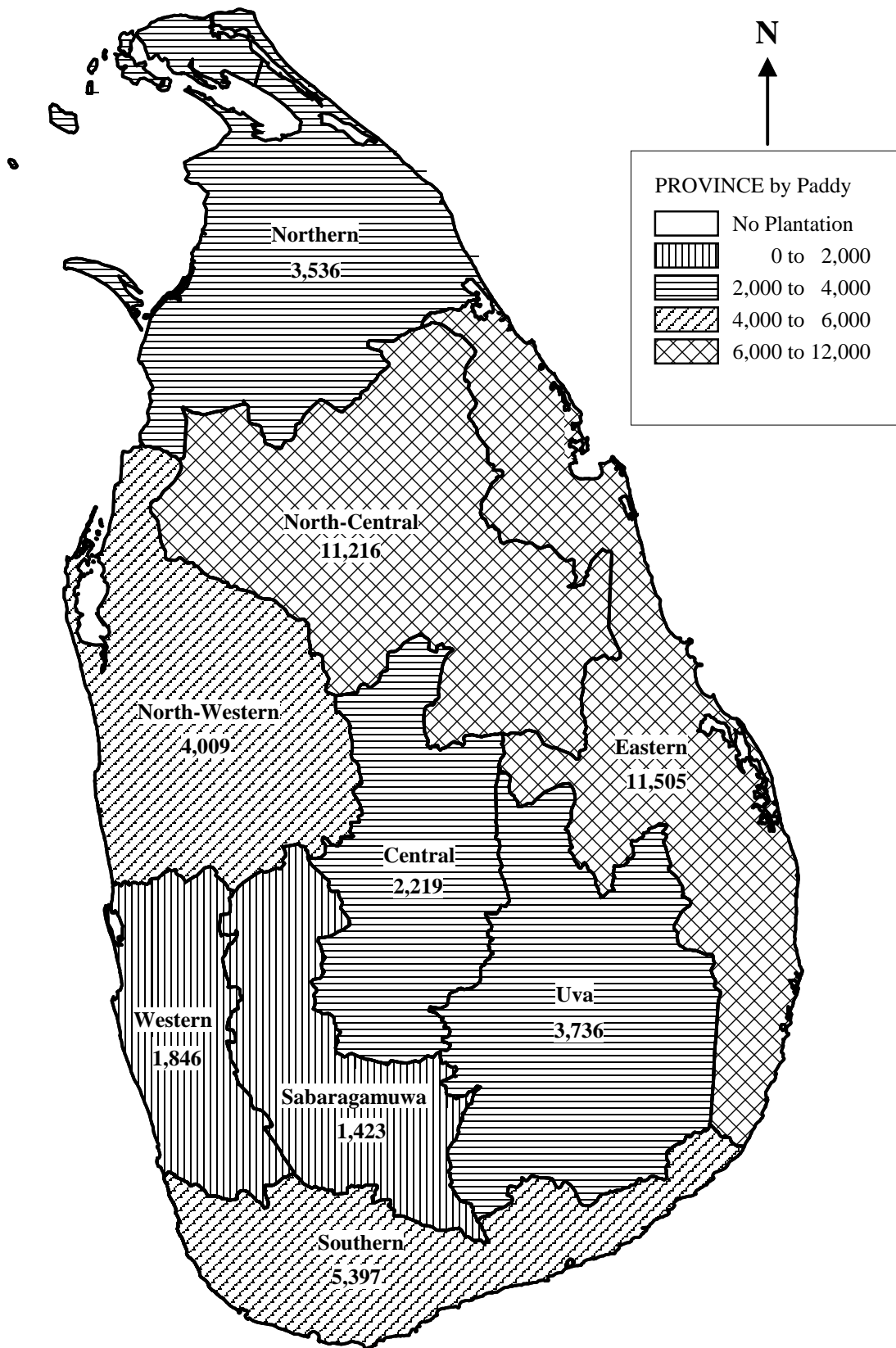

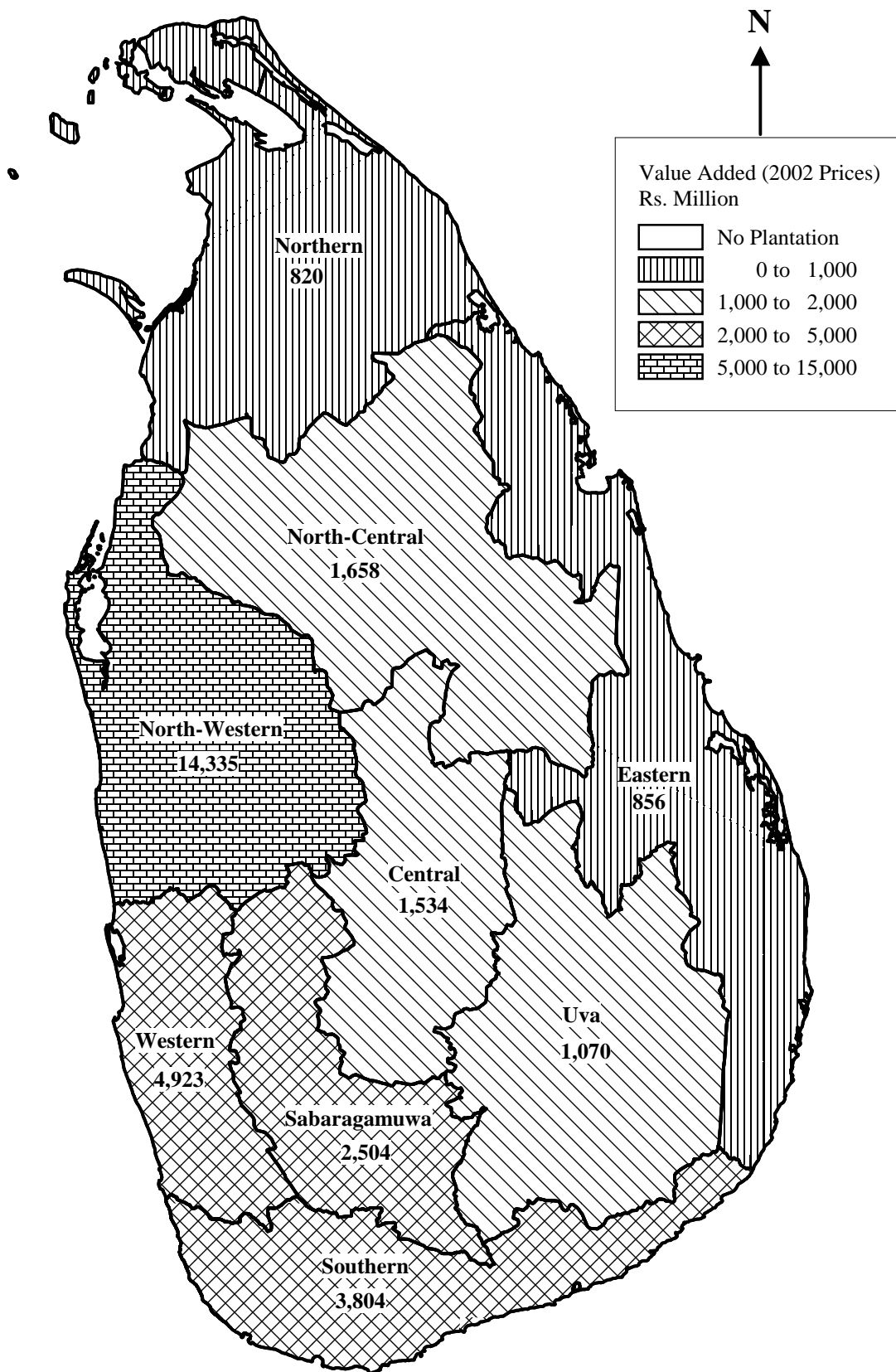
VALUE ADDED OF RUBBER (GROWING) BY PROVINCE - 2012

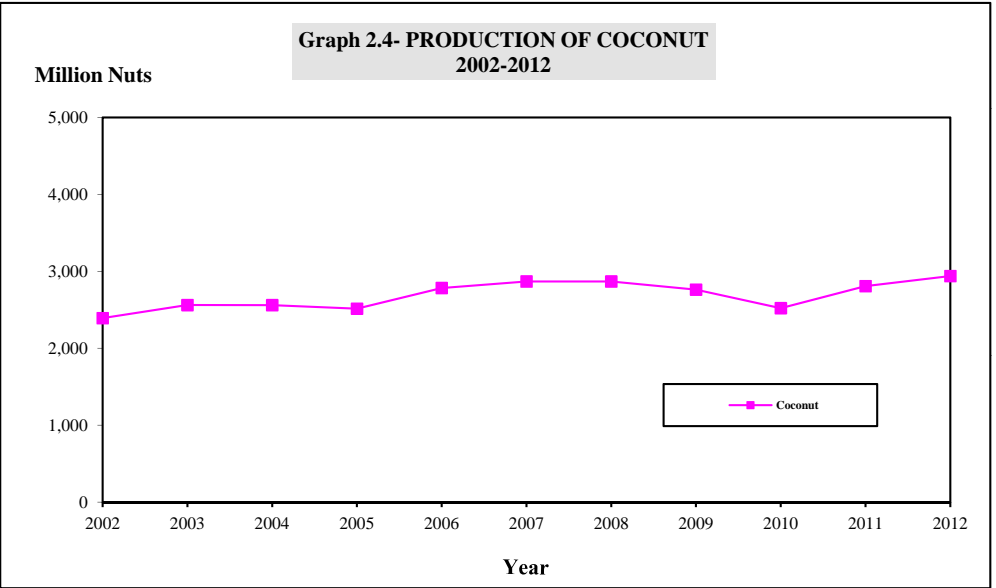
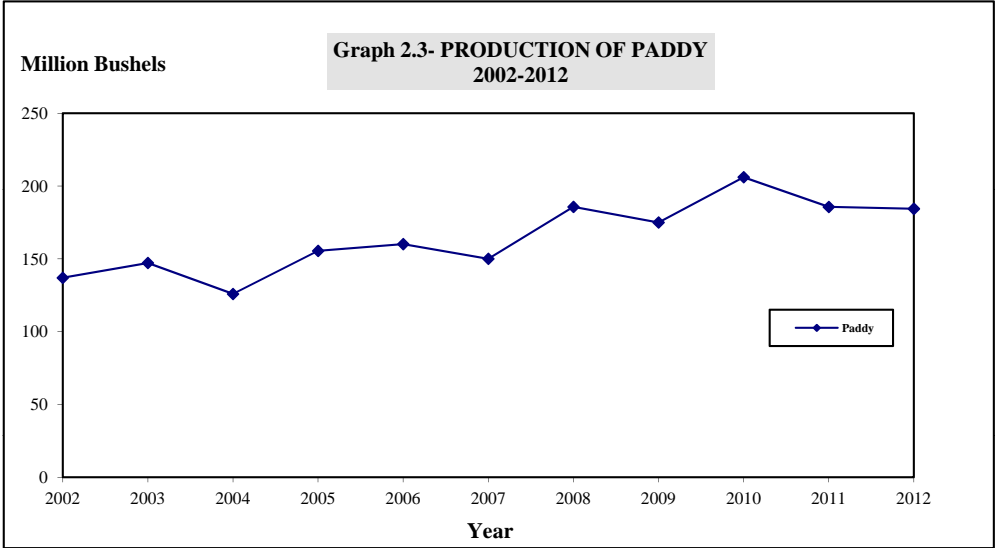
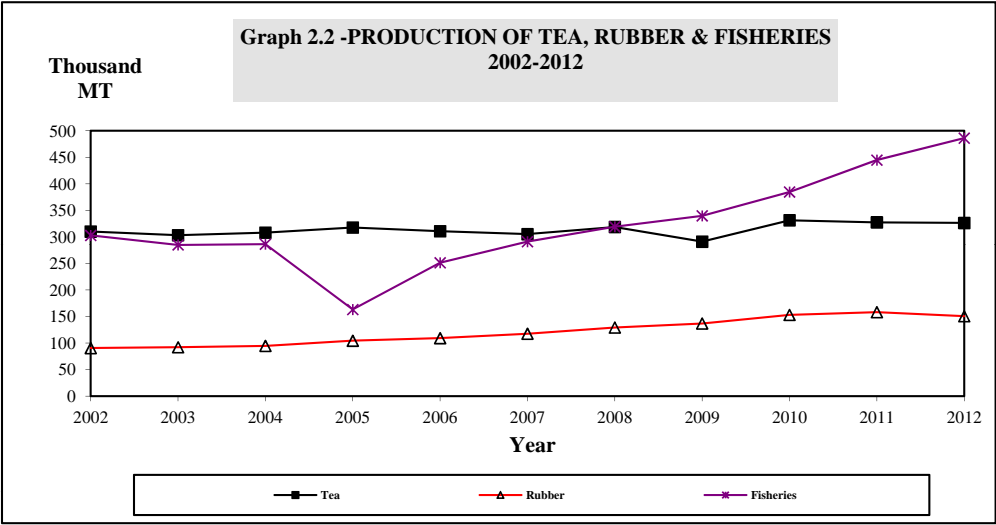


VALUE ADDED OF PADDY (GROWING) BY PROVINCE - 2012

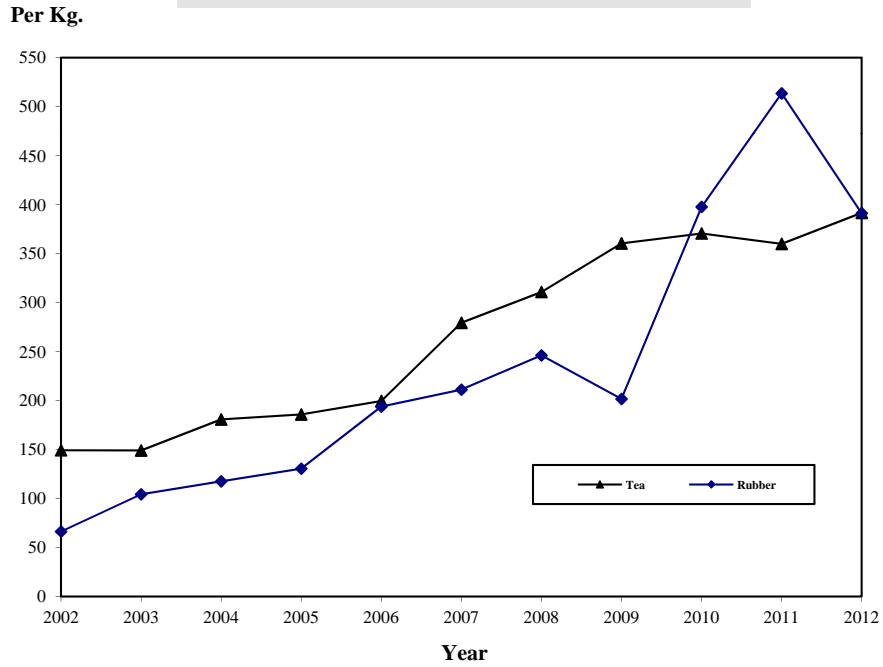


VALUE ADDED OF COCONUT (GROWING) BY PROVINCE - 2012

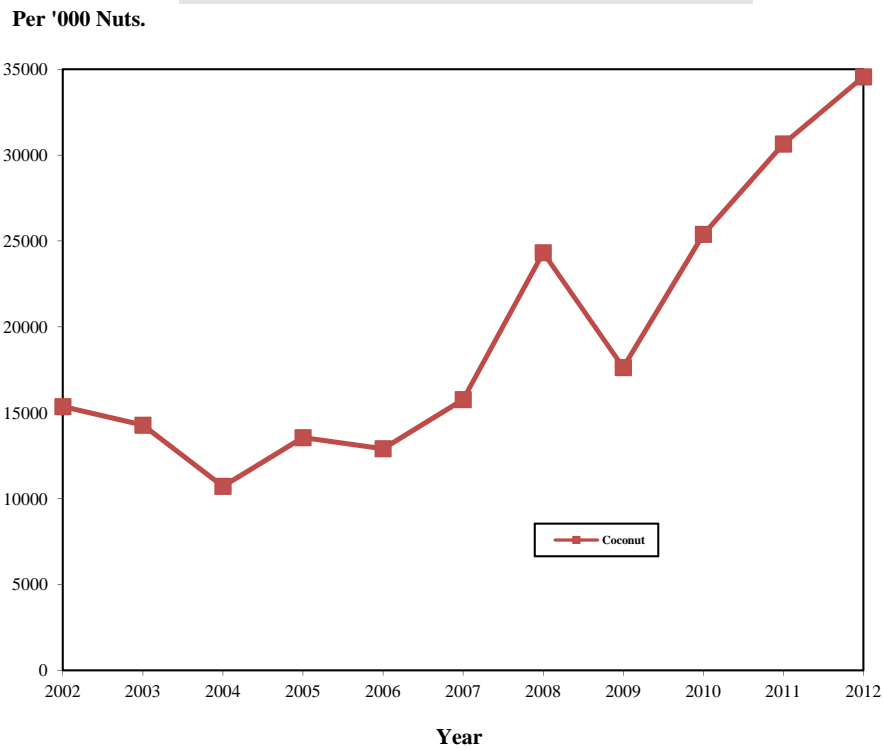




**Graph 2.5- PRICES OF MAJOR COMMERCIAL CROPS

Livestock

The sub sector of Livestock production grew by 6.4 percent in 2012. The growth of this sector was 7.3 percent in 2011. This growth was supported by the production increase of eggs, chicken and milk. The milk production recorded an increase from 258.3 million liters to 299.02 million liters for the year 2012 which implies 15.8 percent. Dairy farming has been started in Northern and Eastern Provinces, due to many of the traditional farmers have returned to their usual profession.

Fishing Industry

The overall Fishing industry grew by 9.3 percent in 2012. Of these "Inland fishing" grew by 14.3 percent and "Marine fishing" grew by 8.5 percent. Drought weather in latter part of the year cause to drop of Inland Fishing growth in 2012 Q4. Although recorded a higher Inland Fish production in Q1, Q2 and Q3, this progress made Inland Fishing development programs currently being operated. The implemented programs for the development of Inland Fishing in 1st and 2nd quarters caused to increase the Fish production.

The growth of Marine Fishing industry has been supported by increase of Fish production in Western and Northern Provinces and the development infrastructure facilities in Fishing industry.

02 MINING AND QUARRYING

Mining and Quarrying sub sector recorded a value added of Rs. 84,672 million at constant prices indicating a growth rate of 18.9 percent in 2012. The corresponding growth rate in 2011 was 18.5 percent with a value added of Rs. 71,191 million.

The value added at current prices of the Mining and Quarrying sector was Rs. 152,113 million in 2012 indicating an increase of 35.3 percent compared with Rs. 112,386 million in 2011.

The low demand export value & quantity of precious stones increased by 41.7 percent and 0.2 percent according to the Sri Lanka Gem & Jewellery Exchange.

Gem industry has an important contribution to the economy by boosting foreign exchange earnings and generating employment from major export destinations in the US and Europe.

Other Mining sub sector grew by 21.1 percent over the growth of 18.8 percent in 2011. Other mining sub sector which accounts for more than 75 percent of the Mining and Quarrying sector in terms of value addition.

03. MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY

The Manufacturing Industry showed a growth rate of 5.2 percent in 2012 at constant (2002) prices as against the growth rate of 7.9 percent recorded for the year 2011. The value added of Manufacturing Industry at current prices indicated an increase of 13.7 percent in 2012.

The Manufacturing Industry is the second major contributor to the GDP indicating a share of 17.1 percent at constant prices for 2012.

At constant (2002) prices, value added of Factory Industry increased by 5.2 percent in 2012. The value added by Cottage Industry indicated a growth rate of 4.6 percent and the value added of Export Processing Industry increased by 6.5 percent in 2012.

The annual rate of increase of value added at current prices for Factory Industry, Cottage Industry and Export Processing Industry were 13.7 percent, 9.5 percent and 17.3 percent respectively for the year 2012.

The value added at constant (2002) prices, of sub sectors of Factory Industries recorded increases as follows. The "Food, Beverages, and Tobacco" by 5.1 percent, "Textile, Wearing Apparel and Leather Products" by 4.9 percent, "Chemicals, Rubber, and Plastic Products" by 5.8 percent, "Non Metallic Products" increased by 6.5 percent. "Fabricated Metal Products" by 5.1 percent and "Other Manufacturing Products" by 5.5 percent for the year 2012 as against the year 2011.

The Board of Investment (BOI)

The BOI approved 187 projects during the year 2012. The employment opportunities created by the approved projects in 2012 were 46,625 as employment and capital investment on approved projects during the year amounted to about Rs.659,627 million comprising Rs.210,865 million as local components and Rs. 448,762 million as

foreign components. It consisted of 32.0 percent as local investment and 68.0 percent as Foreign investment.

According to the law of BOI section 17 act, out of 187 projects agreements were signed only 128 projects.

The Industrial Development Board (IDB)

The (IDB) has assisted for the development and commencement of new industries through its technical services at district level. It has also launched programs in order to promote industrial production and to generate new employment opportunities.

IDB met Rs. 247 million of expenditure for new industries and created 1205 job opportunities through these support service for the year 2012.

Petroleum Products

During the year 2012, the Imported quantity of crude oil decreased by 28.2 percent and refined products increased 12.8 percent. The average international crude oil price (Brent) US dollars 112.41 per barrel in 2012, when compared to US dollars 112.25 per barrel in 2011.

Textile Industry

The "Textile Wearing Apparel & Leather products" industry recorded a 4.9 growth in 2012 compared to 10.8 percent in 2011.

4. ELECTRICITY GAS AND WATER

The value added of the three sub sectors of Electricity Gas and Water at constant (2002) price, increased by 4.4 percent in 2012. In this sector Electricity sub sector contributed high growth rate. The share of this sub sector is above 87.0 percent to the total value added.

In real terms, the value added of the Electricity sub sector increased by 4.3 percent in 2012 over the previous year. In current terms, it was increased by 19.0 percent.

The total power generated by CEB was 6125 GWH and by private sector was 5753 GWH. The Hidropower generation of CEB decreased by 4.4% in 2012 over the previous year , with the power generated decreasing in absolute terms from 2811 GWH to 2687 GWH. The Thermal power generation of CEB increased by 74.7% in 2012.

At constant (2002) prices, the value added of Gas was increased by 5.1 percent and Water was increased by 7.1 percent in 2011.

05. CONSTRUCTION

The value added of the Construction sub sector at current prices was Rs.712,272 million in 2012 compared with Rs.511,220 million in 2011 indicating an increase of 39.3 percent. At constant (2002) prices, it was Rs.247,091 million in 2012 as compared with Rs.203,204 million in 2011 indicating a growth rate of 21.6 percent for the year 2012.

The contribution of Construction sub sector to the GDP at constant (2002) prices was 8.1 percent in the year 2012. It was 7.1 percent in the year 2011.

The total cement production has increased by 28.3 percent to, 5,862,926 MT. in 2012 from 4,568,348 MT in 2011. The disbursement of loan for Constructions of houses, business premises, other buildings, and property developments increased by 15.8 percent during the reference year.

06. WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE, HOTELS AND RESTAURANTS

The Services sector grew by 4.6 percent in the year 2012 over the 8.6 percent growth rate in the year 2011.

The Services sector as a whole accounted for 57.5 percent for the total GDP. Hotels and Restaurants, Transport and Communication and Banking Insurance & Real Estate sectors grew by 20.2 percent, 6.2 percent and 6.7 percent respectively. Wholesale and Retail Trade sector, which is the largest subsector of Services sector recorded a moderate

growth due to weaker performance of external trade activities.

Wholesale & Retail Trade

Wholesale and Retail Trade sector recorded a slower growth of 3.7 percent, over the 10.3 percent higher growth in the previous year. Export and Import Trade that are subsectors of Wholesale and Retail Trade sector recorded slower growth rates in the year 2012. The current value added of this sector increased to Rs. Mn. 1,519,995 in 2012 from Rs. Mn. 1,357,662 in 2011 indicating a 12.0 percent increase. At constant (2002) prices this sector increased to Rs.Mn. 613,320 in the year 2012 from Rs.Mn. 676,565 in 2011 recording a 3.7 percent growth.

Tourism

After the civil war ended in year 2009, Sri Lanka Tourism has surged to new high records of 855,975 in 2011 and 1,005,605 in 2012, surpassing the previous all time high hits. Tourist arrivals as a percentage increase were 30.8 percent and 17.5 percent respectively year 2011 and 2012.

The foreign exchange earning increased from Rs. 91,926 million to Rs. 132,426.5 million by 44.1 percent in 2012.

Region wise, main source of Tourism to Sri Lanka emerged from the Asia in the year 2012 accounting 37.8 percentage of the share. Second highest arrivals come from the Western Europe which contribution 37.1 percent to the total. The other significant contributors to the total are North America 5.9 percent, Middle East 5.6 percent and Australia 5.1 percent each.

Country wise, as in previous years, India emerged as the leading marking to Tourism to Sri Lanka amounting to 176,340 arrivals, accounting for 17.5 percent of the total traffic and contributed 71.2 percent to the South Asia region Tourist arrivals. Other main contributors to the Sri Lanka Tourism are UK, Germany, France and Maldives accounting 11.4 percent, 7.1 percent, 5.6 percent and 4.7 percent respectively in 2012.

Out of total Tourist arrivals 74.4 percent arrived on holiday and pleasure trips, while 8.9 percent arrived on business. A total of 15,510 rooms in 269 in graded establishments were in operation during the period under review.

As a result of the high Tourist traffic during the year the overall annual room occupancy rate of

graded establishment decreased to 71.2 percent from 77.1 percent in the previous year. Regionally highest occupancy rate of 84.2 percent recorded in the Colombo city and followed by greater Colombo 85.3 percent, South coast 80.9 percent and East coast 79.8 percent in 2012.

Tourism has been given high priority in Sri Lanka's development programmes and its forward linkages are also high for other sub sectors of the economy. Direct and indirect employment opportunities are generated from the Tourism related business establishments such as hotels and other accommodation units, restaurants, travel agents, tour operators, recreation and entertainment businesses, souvenir, handicraft and other shops etc. The total number of persons employed directly in the Tourism sector as at end of 2012 amounted to 67,862 which was an increase of 17.4 percent over the figure of 57,786 recorded in 2011. The total number of persons employed indirectly in the Tourism sector as at end of 2012 amounted to 95,007 which was an increase of 17.4 percent over the figure of 80,899 recording 2011.

07. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

The contribution of Transport and Communication sector to the GDP at constant price was 13.0 percent in the year 2012. The value added of this sector at current market prices was Rs.988,688 million for 2012 compared o Rs. 818,386 million for

the previous year indicating a growth rate of 20.8 percent. In real terms, it was Rs.435,872 million in 2012 compared to Rs. 410,402 million in 2011 indicating a growth rate of 6.2 percent for the period under review.

Transport, Cargo Handling and Post and Telecommunication are the sub sectors of this sector.

TRANSPORT

In real terms, the value added of Transport sub sector was Rs. 357,221 million for 2012 compared to Rs. 337,088 million for the previous year indicating a growth rate of 6.0 percent. The road passenger transportation is mostly provided by private bus services, SLTB service and the Department of Railway.

The number of daily operated buses of SLTB has decreased to 4,314 in 2012 from 4,365 in 2011 indicating an decrease of 1.2 percent. passenger income has increased by 19.99 percent for the reference year as compared to the previous year.

The number of new registration of motor vehicles at the Department of Motor Traffic (DMT) decreased by 24.4 percent to 397,295 during the year 2012 from 525,421 in 2011. New registration of buses, motor cycles and goods transport vehicles decreased by 88.2 percent , 24.1 percent and 18.4 percent respectively.

The value added of lorry transportation industry occupied a leading position as a contributor to the Transport sector. Lorries were mainly used for the purpose of transportation of goods.

Cargo Handling - Port and Civil Aviation

The value addition of Cargo Handling sub sector grew by 5.7 percent from Rs. 20,060 million to Rs. 21,194 million in constant prices in 2012. The Sri Lanka Ports Authority (SLPA) was set up in 1979 and administers and operates all specified commercial ports in Sri Lanka. The port of Colombo being the premier port in the country has naturally become the focal point of the all port development activities in Sri Lanka since the formation of the SLPA. However, as a consequent of the government policy to develop the regional areas in the country, the SLPA attaches equal emphasis on the development of Ports of Galle , Trincomalee, Kankasanthurai , Point Pedru and a new port at Hambantota.

The amount of total Cargo throughput of Port Authority has decreased by -0.1 percent. It was recorded to MT 65,030.1 thousands from MT 65,096.6 thousands in the reference year. Container handling of Port Authority has decreased from 4,262,887 to 4,187,120 by -1.8 percent and port of Colombo set new records by handling over 4 million Twenty Foot Equivalent Units

(TEUs) of containers in both years 2011 and 2012. Total number of ships arrived to the country was 4,134 and it was a -4.6 percent decrease compared to the previous year.

The principal activities of the Sri Lankan Airlines consist of operating international scheduled, non-scheduled air services for the carriage of passengers, freight and mail as the designated carrier of Sri Lanka. Providing Air Terminal services at the Bandaranaike International Airport, sale of duty free goods on-board, marketing inbound and outbound holiday packages constitute other main activities. Providing third party maintenance, flight operation services and conducting aviation related training programs constitute ancillary activities of the company. Mihin Lanka main focus is providing low cost flights from Colombo to a number of cities in India and the Gulf States and commenced their operations on 24th April 2007.

The total number of passenger kilometers flown by Sri Lankan Airlines increased from 10,676,945 to 12,790,217 by 19.8 percent while passenger revenue increased from Rs. 65,340.4 million to Rs. 88,219.6 million by 35 percent in the reference year 2012 compared with the previous year. Cargo carriage of Sri Lankan Airlines increased by 8.9 percent in this period under review. Number of aircraft in operation increased from 21 to 22 end of the year 2012 compared with same period of 2011.

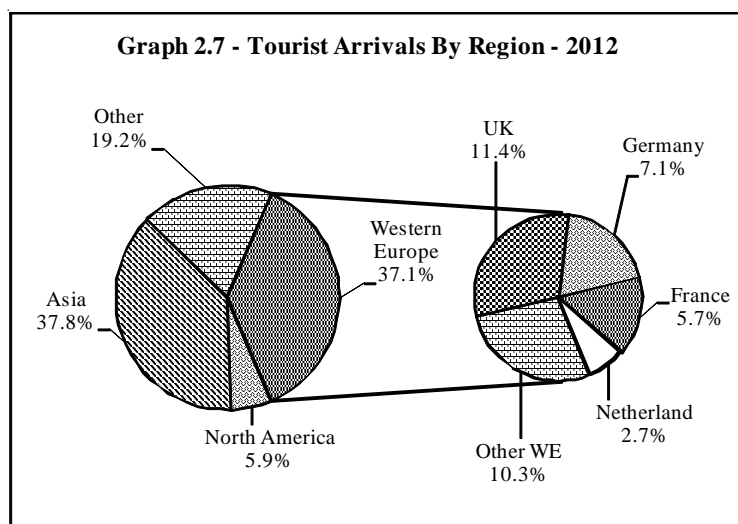

POST & TELECOMMUNICATION

The value addition of Post & Telecommunication sub sector grew by 7.9 percent to Rs. 57,457 million in 2012 compared with the Rs. 53,254 million in the year 2011. The end of nearly three decades war has opened the entire country to embrace mobile phones for their communication purposes and this development has contributed to increase the number of mobile phone subscribers in Sri Lanka. Compared to fixed phone subscribers, the mobile phone industry has shown a rapid increase during the past few years. Fixed phone subscribers are comparatively higher than the mobile phone subscribers till 2001 and after that it has completely changed in to other way. Mobile phone subscribers in Sri Lanka to a staggering 20,324,070 by the end of year 2012 and it was five times higher than compared to 3,449,391 fixed phone subscribers. The telephone density (the number of connections per 100 persons) has recorded 106 in 2011 and 117 in 2012.

Fierce competition among five mobile phone operators and four fixed phone subscribers in the country, services with latest technology are provided into the market and offer cheaper rate for the customers. Both fixed and mobile internet & email subscribers increased by 17.8 percent and number of public pay phone booths increased by 8.1 percent during the period of under review.

Main post office, sub post office and agency post office have been established to meet the demand in postal services. The average number of letters per inhabitants handled by the Department of Postal was 14 during the year 2012.

8. BANKING, INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE etc.

The current value added and constant value added of Banking sector increased by 11.1 percent and 8.9 percent in respectively in 2012.

The Sri Lankan Banking system remained stable due to recorded healthy profits mainly through the increase in interest income & non interest income in 2012.

As at end of 2012, The Banking sector comprised of total number of 33 Banks and it consists of 24 Licensed Commercial Banks (LCBs) and 9 Licensed Specialized Banks (LSBs). The LCBs consists of 2 State Banks, 10 Domestic Banks and 12 Foreign Banks. There are 6 State Banks and 3 Private Banks operated under the Licensed Specialized Banks.

The number of domestic bank branches increased to 2,476 in 2012 from 2,403 in 2011 while the foreign bank branches remained same in 2012.

The bank branch network (LCBs & LSBs) increased to 3,368 in 2012 from 3,341 in 2011. Other Financial Service outlets increased to 4,171 in 2012 from 4,053 in 2011. (Other Financial Service Outlets are included Extension Offices, Pay Offices, Pawning Canters, Student Savings Units & Postal Units)

When considering the deposits of the previous year of the Licensed Commercial Banks, Demand Deposits, Savings Deposits, Time Deposits and Other Deposits are inclined by 2.6 percent, 0.6 percent, 6.8 percent and 4.6 percent in respectively and furthermore Time Deposits and Savings Deposits of the Non-Bank Financial Institutions are increased by 43.5 percent and 7.0 percent.

In year 2012, there were 21 insurance companies registered under the Insurance Board of Sri Lanka (IBSL). According to the IBSL 12 companies are engaging in long term and general insurance while 3 companies are engaged in long term (life) insurance.

09. OWNERSHIP OF DWELLINGS

The value added of this sector was Rs.212,129 million at current market prices in 2012, indicating an increase of 12.1 percent, while in constant terms it was Rs.76,926 million expressing a growth rate of 1.7 percent in 2012. The average growth rate of this sub sector was 1.2 percent in 2011.

Improvement in this sector was mainly due to the implementation of many large-scale housing projects targeted to stimulate house-owning population coupled with attractive incentives for house building. Percentage contribution of this sector to the overall economy (GDP) amounts to 2.5 percent in 2012.

10. GOVERNMENT SERVICES

The value added of Government Services at current market prices in 2012 was Rs.570,973 million in contrast to its value of Rs. 532,455 million in 2011 showing an increase of 7.2 percent. In real terms, it was Rs. 207,559 million in 2012 against Rs. 204,704 million in 2011 indicating a growth rate of 1.4 percent.

11. PRIVATE SERVICES

The value added of Private Services in 2012 was Rs.165,736 million at current market prices compared to Rs.143,551 million in the previous year. Registering an increase of 15.5 percent. In constant 2002 prices, it was Rs.70,779 million in 2011 compared to Rs.67,119 million in the previous year, showing an increase of 5.5 per cent. The value added percentage share to GDP from this sector was 2.2 percent.

PART THREE

EXPENDITURE ON GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

The expenditure approach to measure the Gross Domestic Product examines at the final uses of the country's output such as Private Consumption, Government Consumption, Capital Formation, Change in Stocks and Net Exports (exports less imports). It identifies the Expenditure on total goods and services that have occurred during the reference year.

The value of Gross Domestic Expenditure (GDE) is same as the value of GDP and it is considered as the control total for compilation of GDE on expenditure approach. So, any discrepancy in these two estimates is included in change in stocks as statistical discrepancy.

1. PRIVATE CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE (PCE)

In 2012, at current market prices, the PCE was estimated at Rs 5,274,451 million as against a value of Rs 4,568,393 million in 2011. This was a 15.5 percent increase over the previous year.

Private Consumption Expenditure as a percentage of GDP indicated 69.6 percent for the year 2012 where as it was 69.8 percent in the year 2011.

Food Beverages and Tobacco the largest consumption item within Private Consumption Expenditure is increased by 16.6 percent in 2012 as against 17.9 percent in 2011. This was mainly due to lower prices for food and beverages category throughout the year 2012. Expenditure on Transport increased 22.6 percent in 2012 as against 30.7 percent in 2011.

2. GENERAL GOVERNMENT FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE (GFCE)

The GFCE for the year under review was Rs.1,021,443 million at current market prices compared to Rs. 967,702 million in 2011, showing an increase of 5.6 percent in the year 2012.

In constant terms, it was Rs.426, 223 million in 2012 in contrast to Rs.428,623 million in 2011 indicating a negative growth rate of 0.56 percent for 2012.

Out of total Government Final Consumption Expenditure 70.8 percent was spent on Defence, Social Security & Welfare, Education and General Public Services in 2012.

Largest share of the Government Final Consumption Expenditure was on Defence, and it was 24.6 percent in 2012. The expenditure for "Social Security & Welfare" 19.3 percent, "Education" 15.2 percent and "General Public Services" 11.6 percent placed the second, third and fourth respectively, in the reference year. Expenditure on Education and Health sector have increased by 1.04 percent and 6.02 percent during this period compared with the previous year.

The expenditure on Defence as a percentage share to total Government Consumption Expenditure in

2012 was 24.6 percent where as it was 25.4 percent in 2011.

3. CAPITAL FORMATION

The Gross Domestic Fixed Capital Formation (GFCF) which stood at Rs. 1,772,515 million at current price in 2011 has risen to Rs.2,189,805 million in 2012 indicating an increase of 23.5 percent. At constant terms, it recorded a value of Rs.795,458 million in 2011 as compared with Rs.880,288 million in 2012, Indicating a growth rate of 10.7 percent. The ratio of GFCF to GDP at current prices was 28.9 percent comprising 22.4 percent from the private sector and 6.5 percent from the government sector for the year 2012.

The three main sectors of GFCF, namely the Construction, Machinery & Equipment, and Land Improvement & Plantation Development, contributed 63.9 percent, 29.7 and 6.4 percent, respectively at current price in the corresponding year.

GFCF is a combination of private sector GFCF and Government sector GFCF, and contributions to GFCF are by 77.4 percent and by 22.6 respectively. In 2012 private sector GFCF increased by 20.9 percent and Government sector GFCF increased by 33.6 percent.

4. IMPORTS

The total payment of merchandised Imports increased by 4.2 percent in 2012 as against the 43.3 percent in 2011. The Imports of Consumer goods which consist of nearly one sixth of the total imports decreased by 6.6 percent in 2012. The share of Imports of Consumer goods showed a from 18.5 percent in 2011 to 16.6 percent in 2012. Imports of Intermediate goods which is the largest subsector in Imports increased by 34.9 percent in 2012. This sector has increased by 27.8 percent in the previous year as well. The share of this sector has increased up to 58.0 percent and this indicator for the year 2011 was 44.8 percent. Petroleum the largest sector, within intermediate Imports increased by 10.5 percent in 2012. Imports of Chemical and Textile & Clothing increased by 10.5 percent and 12.8 percent respectively in the year 2012. Imports of Fertilizer decreased by 11.4 percent in 2012.

Investment goods hold one fourth of total Imports has decreased by 28.0 percent in 2012. Sub categories of investment goods namely Building Materials, and Machinery & Equipment increased by 32.3 percent and 21.2 percent respectively. Transport equipment and all other investment goods imports decreased by 10.4 percent and 99.8 percent in 2012.

Graph 3.1- COMPOSITION OF GFCF 2002-2012 (Percentage of GDP)

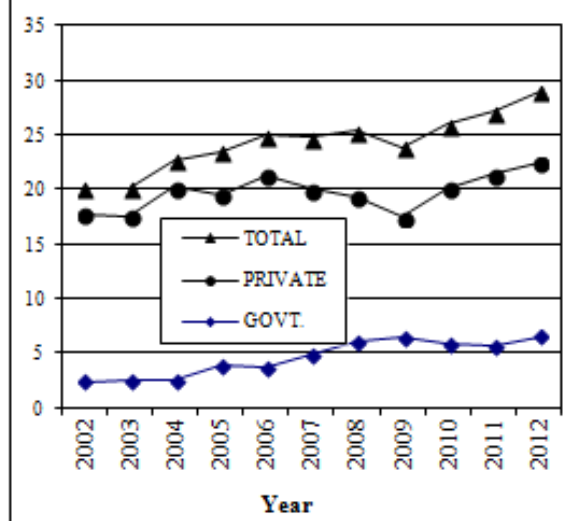

5. EXPORTS

Overall rupee value of Exports at current terms increased by 9.0 percent in 2012 as against the growth of 18.6 percent in 2011. The changes of Export income during the recent years can be seen in table 3.7.

The composition of Exports for the year 2012 indicated 67.9 percent from Industrial Exports, 25.2 percent from Agricultural Exports, 1.3 from Mineral Exports and 5.6 percent from Other Exports.

Within the total Exports, Agricultural Exports indicated an annual increase of 5.2 percent on average. Within the Agricultural Exports, Export income of Tea and Minor Agricultural crops recorded increase of 9.4 percent and 14.4 percent, while Rubber and Coconut products indicated decreases of 31.1 percent and 9.9 percent respectively.

Exports of Industrial products increased by 8.8 percent in 2012, mainly led by the Textile & Wearing Apparel, Food Beverages & Tobacco and Chemical Products. Textile & Wearing Apparel Exports grew by 9.7 percent over the 21.7 percent increase of previous year. This sector contributes 64.2 percent to the Industrial exports sector.

Earnings from Mineral exports grew by 22.1 percent in the year 2012 as against the 1.1 percent increase in the year 2011.

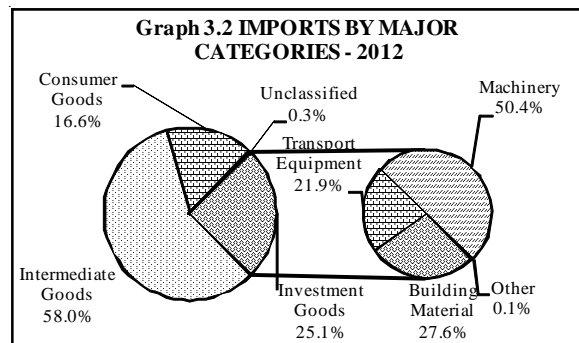

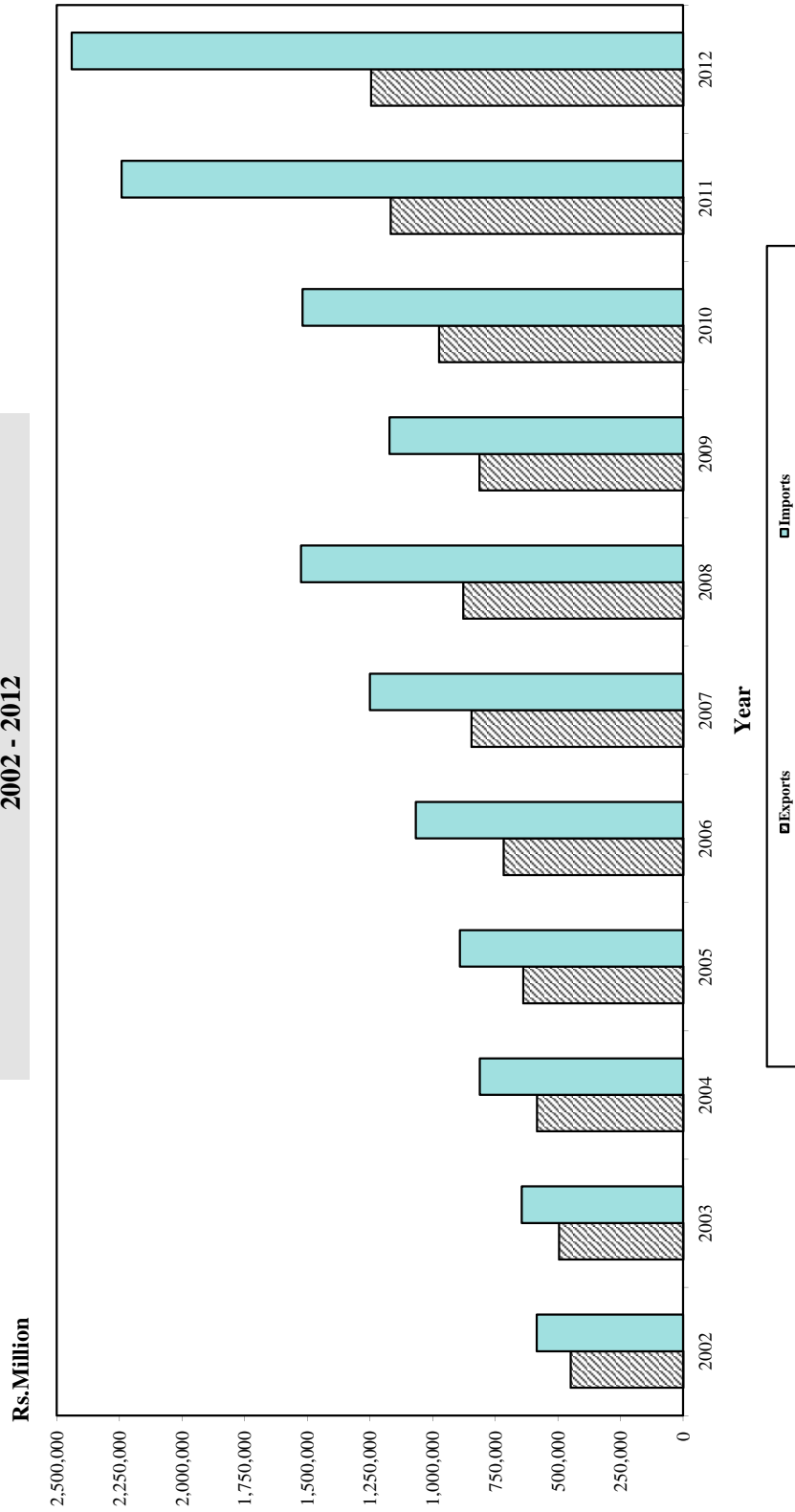

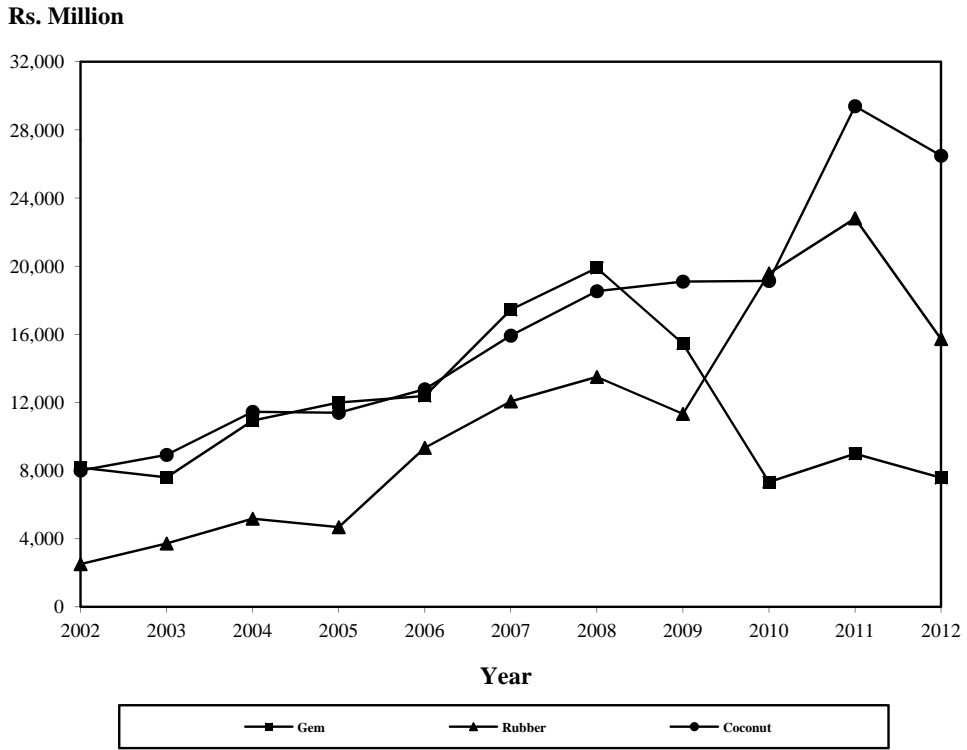

Graph 3.5 - FOREIGN EARNINGS FOR SELECTED CATEGORIES 2002- 2012

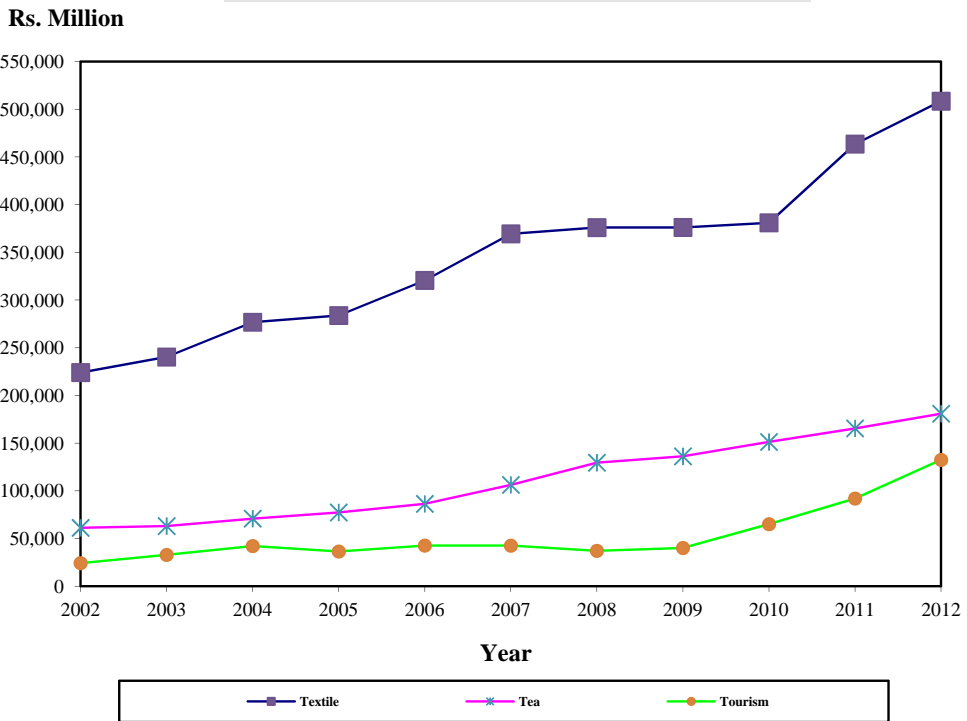

Balance of Trade

Balance of Trade for Sri Lanka has recorded a deficit for the year 2012. Trade balance can be briefly defined as the difference between export income and expenditure on imports. According to the structures of exports and imports of Sri Lanka and prices in the world market, expenditure on imports normally higher than the export income. Balance of Trade and other related indicators are presented in Table 3.9.

1. WEATHER

Table 4.1 depicts that the 30 year average rainfall and the annual rainfall for the last four years in selected stations in Wet-zone and the Dry-zone.

The island experienced comparatively higher rainfall for 2012. The Wet-zone rainfall stations, in Colombo, Rathnapura, Kandy & Nuwara-Eliya shown in the table 4.1 indicated lower rainfall for 2012 compared to the average rainfall for 30 years from 1961 to 1990. Considering the Dry-zone rainfall station Anuradapura, Trincomalle and Hambantota have a higher rainfall, Jaffna district reported a lower rainfall compared to the 30 year average rainfall.

2. COLOMBO CONSUMERS' PRICE INDEX (CCPI) (Base 2006/2007=100)

The CCPI (Base 2006/2007 = 100) is simply a measure, expressed in index form of the changes in the cost of market basket, as prices of items in it change overtime. The CCPI (Base 2006/2007) is the country's official Price Index, and is used to monitor the change of price movement. The weighting pattern of this index based on expenditure of all urban Household Income and Expenditure Survey during the 12 month period July 2006 to June 2007.

The CCPI increased by 11.4 index point change in 2012 over the previous year value of 2011 with the index increasing in absolute terms from 151.5 to 162.9.

Inflation as measured by the CCPI increased to 7.55 percent in 2012 from 6.72 percent in 2011.
